### Colorado Mines' Friehauf, Livingstone's Gordon Headline 2004 Football Gazette All-America Team

PITTSBURG, Kan. — Harlon Hill Trophy winning quarterback **Chad Friehauf** from Colorado School of Mines and Division II tackle-leading linebacker **Moises Gordon** from Livingstone College headline a talented 2004 *Don Hansen's Football Gazette* NCAA Division II All-America team.

Albany State University's **Mike White**, who led the Rams to an 11-1 record and an NCAA-II national quarterfinal appearance, was named the National Coach of the Year. White led ASU, the first Historically Black University to reach the NCAA-II quarterfinals, to 19 consecutive victories between the 2003 and 2004 seasons, before falling, 38-24, to eventual national champion Valdosta State University.

Friehauf and Pittsburg State University running back **Germaine Race** shared Offensive Back of the Year honors. **Chris Samp** of Winona State University, a Hill Trophy finalist, was named the Receiver of the Year, while **Nathan Baker** of Pittsburg State earned Offensive Lineman of the Year. **Kevin Burton** of Southeastern Oklahoma State University received the second annual Division II Rimington Award as the division's top offensive center †.

On defense, **Walter Curry** of Albany State was named Lineman of the Year honors, while **Gordon** earned Linebacker of the Year and **Howard Williams** of Elizabeth City State University earned Defensive Back of the Year. Punter **Jeff Williams** of Adams State College was named Specialist of the Year.

Friehauf, a senior quarterback from Brush, Colo., passed for 4,646 yards and 39 touchdowns in leading the Orediggers to a 12-1 overall record and an NCAA-II playoff berth. Friehauf, the runaway winner of the Hill Trophy as the National Player of the Year, set Division II records for total offense (5,363 yards) and passing yards (4,646) this fall.

Race, a sophomore from Warrensburg, Mo., rushed the ball 247 times for 2,213 yards and 26 touchdowns in leading the Gorillas to a 14-1 season and the national runner-up finish. Race set NCAA-II single-season records for highest average per carry (9.0 ypc) and 100-yard games (13). He also registered the fifth-highest rushing total in DII history (2,213 yards).

Gordon, a senior from Patterson, N.J., recorded 154 tackles (65 solo) with 24.0 tackles-for-loss and 2.0 quarterback sacks, leading DII in tackles per game (15.4 pg). He also intercepted two passes, logged three pass breakups and forced two fumbles.

This marks the 17th year *Don Hansen's Football Gazette*, a recognized authority on small college football, has selected an NCAA Division II All-America team. The national publication selected All-Region teams with the first-team and second-team All-Region players from each of the four geographic regions (Northeast, Southeast, Northwest, Southwest) making up the national ballot, which was voted upon by a 23-member national panel.

A total of 142 players earned some form of *Football Gazette* All-America honors. Players from 69 of the 149 football-playing schools in Division II earned *Football Gazette* All-America accolades. National runner-up Pittsburg State led the way with four players earning first-team All-America honors, while national champion Valdosta State had three first-team honorees.

† The Boomer Esiason Foundation, which established the Dave Rimington Trophy in 2000 to honor the outstanding Division I-A center, expanded that award in 2003 to include the top center on each of the Don Hansen's Football Gazette Division I-AA, II, III and NAIA All-America squads. Esiason, a high-octane Maryland quarterback, and Rimington, a nonpareil center for Nebraska, were NFL teammates at Cincinnati in the mid-1980s.

In 1993, Esiason created the New York City based foundation that bears his name to raise funds for the treatment and research of cystic fibrosis, a genetic disease his 14-year-old son Gunnar has had since infancy.
